This constitutes a notable example of a landscape illustrating a unique response of wine growing that transformed a small volcanic island following the arrival of the first colonists in the 15th century.

The colonists transformed a rocky and apparently unproductive landscape into an extraordinary landscape of small plots surrounded by stone walls carved by man, bearing witness to the work of generations of small farmers, who, in a hostile environment, managed to create a way of life and to produce a high quality wine.
